Tiffany Gambill had been playing soccer for Bridgewater town and travel teams since she was eight years old. She loved the game. There was only one problem: at the age of 13, Tiffany began to notice unusual symptoms. She'd try to kick the ball, but it wouldn't be where she thought it was. She was losing her balance often, more than the typical clumsiness of a growing teen. Tiffany started to have trouble keeping up with her teammates.

After years of doctors visits and tests, Tiffany was diagnosed at age 15 with Friedreich's Ataxia, a rare neuromuscular disease that affects about one of 50,000 people in the U.S. Friedreich's Ataxia causes muscle weakness, loss of coordination, vision impairment and can lead to diabetes, scoliosis and heart problems. There is no cure.

Now 20 and a sophomore at UMASS Dartmouth, the disease has begun to take its toll on Tiffany. She's become very unbalanced, requiring the use of a walker. But Tiffany refuses to let FA stop her. With an unyielding positive attitude, Tiffany has no intention of giving up her goals.

A service dog could assist Tiffany in everyday activities, like walking to class or hanging out with friends. A service dog could replace her walker, making getting around more safe and accessible.

Tiffany and her family need your help. While life-changing and helpful, service dogs are expensive. The "Soccer for Tiffany" tournament is being held to raise funds to help the Gambill's give Tiffany the help she needs.
